An active social entrepreneur and speaker on global health care transformation, Grundy is driving comprehensive, linked and integrated health care. He is known as the "godfather" of the concept of patient-centered medical homes.

Grundy is the founding president of the nonprofit

Patient-Centered Primary Care Collaborative and is IBM's director of global health care transformation. In his role at IBM, he develops and executes strategies that support the company's health care industry transformation initiatives. Part of his work is directed toward shifting health care delivery around the world toward consumer-focused, primary care-based systems through the adoption of new philosophies, primary care pilot programs, new incentives systems, and the information technology required to implement such change.

His work has been reported widely in The New York Times, BusinessWeek, Forbes, New England Journal of Medicine and newspapers, radio and television around the country. He is invited frequently as a thought leader to conferences such as TED, NHS Confederation, and Foundation for Healthcare Transformation.

Grundy is also an adjunct professor at the University of Utah Department of Family and Preventive Medicine. In 2012, he was elected to the Institute of Medicine.

CME CREDIT

The Ohio University Heritage College of Osteopathic Medicine Consortium for Health Education in Appalachia Ohio's Office of Continuing Medical Education is approved as an accredited CME sponsor by the American Osteopathic Association. 
